TMR ‘VIRTUAL’ RE-UNION A SUCCESS



On Saturday September 12, 2020, yet another first for many of us, due to the Corona Virus. The TMR Alumni Day was held on line, and was a lot of fun for all who attended it. Old friends remembered adventures from yesteryear and new friendships were created. A shout-

out needs to go to our Association member **Johannes Knoops** and his team for the excellent job they did. The day started off with a TMR promo film, then an introduction of the day by Camping Director **Wayne Holmes**. We next had a tour of some of the TMR landmarks with tour guides (and Association members) **Frank Rickenbaugh** and **Johannes Knoops**. Interspersed with the video tours were cameo appearances from many TMR alumni recounting memories of camp and campers.

This first hour video portion ended around 1:PM and then broke into a number of live chat rooms. There was one for the Crystal Lake camps, another for Schiff Camps one for the Delaware



Camps, still another about patch collecting. It was in these live chat rooms that the program really came alive, with many people getting involved, recounting tales of their experiences, many of which were shared by if not all, many. We learned about current camp and Scouting as well.



Going into the re-union, the big question was how this would all work out and it looks as if the vote is unanimous; all who partook, really enjoyed the entire event, giving it a Class “A” Clap.

We are optimistic about summer 2021 and with that in mind, the Board of Directors has made its allocations for camperships. We have increased our TMR-Scout allocation by 11% bringing the amount to \$5,000 in Camperships for Scouts to attend TMR. Cub Camperships will again be \$1,000 for a total commitment of \$6,000. With the current strain on families, we are also going to increase the amount of what a family annual income is to be considered for a campership from us. This should allow for more Scouts for us to assist.

Though we feel it's never too early to start planning, we were looking forward to another Awards & Fellowship Luncheon for November 2021. It would celebrate our Associations 35th Anniversary as well as allow us to again recognize hard working Scouters from our Queens leaders.

Thank you for the latest issue of "The Beagle Barks"! I hope all our members are proud of what you do to keep Suanhacky and Jack Kohler's memory vital and relevant.

A word about the Lodge House, featured on the front page: I was Suanhacky lodge chief 1949-50, and we felt the need for a headquarters for the brothers. Little did I dream that 70 years later it would still grace the top of Stag Hill, and still important enough to warrant an upkeep by the ranger staff.

Somehow, back then, we raised \$1,000 and I asked GNYC to draw up a construction plan, which they did. I'm not sure who actually built it, but Jack Kohler and Walter Engel, the following year, assured me that they saw it being built and that the foundation "will last for a century" due to the empty beer cans holding it up as part of the foundation. Thank God for that!

The last time I saw it, about 11 years ago, it had a Coke machine in front, which seemed to me to be highly inappropriate. I remember asking some to have it removed, which probably happened.

KOHLER CABIN UPDATE

We stay in touch with Scott Bosworth, our Ranger at Alpine to review maintenance and the needs of our 'namesake' cabin. Time and weather had taken a toll on the facility. There is also planning for future use.

The immediate need is for all new windows at the cabin, which will also allow for better insulation and save on the cost of heat. New bunks are also needed, along with plans to extend the structure along with building a screened in back room to allow for more activities there.



We were given a cost estimate of \$25,000-\$30,000 for these items. AT the October Board of Directors meeting, there was a lengthy discussion on what if anything we should offer.

Our Board decided in a unanimous vote that we would pledge \$10,000 towards the completion of the project. We also will suggest that Council approach other individuals or groups to come up with funds as well, being this will be an asset for all Scouts to use moving forward.

This is the single largest commitment we have ever made, but feel it is well worth the investment in the future for Scouts and we'll all get a great return on it.

SUANHACKY LODGE HOUSE

Last year, our Association gave funds for maintenance of the Suanhacky Lodge House. **Wayne Holmes**, Director of Camping for GNYC reported the following to our President Mitch Morgenstern. The interior walls and ceiling of the Suanhacky Lodge House have been painted. A thorough clean up also to ensure it is looking fresh for our weekend campers. This is how the funds that we donated were spent in an effort to upkeep of the Suanhacky Lodge House.



Like with the Kohler Cabin, plans are being made to upgrade the Lodge House as well because of its use as a weekend camping destination for many units. These plans may include extending the building, digging a well and building a full bathroom facility for year-round camping opportunities.
