
TEN MILE RIVER, 95 YEARS OF CAMPING EXCELLENCE



6 DEGREES OF QUEENS SCOUTING (OR SUANHACKY BRUSHES WITH FAME)

In our last issue, we had an article about Mr. Warmth, **Don Rickles** and his being a TMR Scout campewr from Queens.

A number of weeks back, we had the sad news that Queens native, **James Caan** passed away. Though we do not know if James was ever a Scout, or went to TMR, but we do know of the connection he had with Queens Scouting and Suanhacky.

In what is perhaps one of the most famous movie murder scenes ever done, in **The GODFATHER I**, when Sonny (James Cann) is killed on the causeway, one of the hitmen who machine guns him in the ambush, and then kicks Sonny while he's down, was Queens Scouter and Suanhacky Vigil Brother, **Armand Lessard** (his name was: Schauwewi which means Inexhaustible). Armand was from what is now Pathfinder District and worked at Camp Man, Lakeside and Central.
